Food Distribution



West Hyattsville Baptist Church partners with Traders Joe's for a food distribution. The food is available to members, friends and neighbors bi-weekly on Fridays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

The distribution generally consists of fresh produce, breads, and often non-food items as well, however, the items vary depending on what's available that week. Volunteers typically help from around 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., sorting food and cleaning up afterward.

The purpose of this unique ministry is to minister the gospel through various forms of visual interpretation including step and mime.

The ministry is led and choreographed by Allissa Jones. The talent and dedication of the dancers are seen and felt each time we are blessed with a performance.

Youth Ministry

The WHBC youth ministry caters to teens between the ages of 13-18. The ministry meets three times a month, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sunday. We approach the study of God's word via a topical method. These topics are very relevant to our teens for example "Relationships: with friends, with the opposite sex and other Christians, Social media use, drug use, etc.

We have discussions, debates, watch relevant videos, pray and also play games that teach them the word of God.

We plan to start a monthly fellowship on Sundays after service. Some of these fellowships will take place at church and others will be a group outing.
